

## **Squash Tasmania Junior Coaching Team Regulation**

Coaches of all State Junior Team players will be invited to attend the Australian Junior Open and Australian Junior Championships. Out of this group of coaches who decide to attend the Performance Pathway Committee will select a coach to act as team leader this person will also be the Tour Manager.

The coaching team will have the following responsibilities:

- To ensure that all players understand their draws at the Australian Junior Championships (AJC).
- To ensure all players are on court on time for all their matches.
- To keep track of player results (maintain an up to date copy of the draws).
- To ensure that players on court are at least supported by either an attending coach or another team member.
- To participate in nightly team meetings conducted by the Coaching Team Leader/Tour Manager at the tournament discussing the days play, and match times and other instructions for the following day.
- To ensure that all players meet their refereeing and scoring responsibilities at the tournament, and receive assistance where necessary from other team members.
- Ensure that the player code of conduct is maintained by all players in particular on court conduct.
- Pass on information relating to tournament regulations to coaches, players and tour party

The Coaching Team Leader/Tour Manager will also assume the following responsibilities:

- Attend the Australian Junior Championships State Managers' meetings and other events as required and ensure State requirements from Squash Australia and Tournament controllers are met.
- Ensure any other tournament responsibilities are undertaken.
- Will have the responsibility of chair meetings of the coaching team to allocate which matches any reserve players will participate in. Each reserve player is guaranteed two games, the line one and two players are to miss one game each to allow this. Games should be allocated in a manner to ensure the best results for the Tasmanian team and should take into account the opposition, the recommendation of other coaches in attendance, and fatigue level or injuries of primary players.
- The coaching team at their discretion may allocate further matches to a reserve player e.g. in the event of injury or fatigue of the other players. The reasons for any substitution should be noted in their report to Squash Tasmania. The decision of the Coaching Team on this matter is final.

The Coaching Team Leader/Tour Manager will be the contact person for Squash Australian and will have the following responsibilities:

- Report to the Performance Pathway Committee regarding coaching group and player results at the tournament prior to the next meeting of the Committee.
- Pass on information relating to tournament regulations to coaches, players and tour party

- Ensure any necessary disciplinary action is taken with respect to player conduct when at the tournament.
- To conduct nightly meetings while away at the event which must be attended by all travelling members of the team, even if staying at alternate accommodation. Meetings should include details of transport, meals, etc for the following day and should include a discussion by the Coaching Team on the day's matches and following days match times etc.
